Murdock previously served as Director of the U.S. Bureau of the Census having been nominated for the position by President Bush and served until the administration change in January of 2009. He was also the first official State Demographer of Texas. He has authored or edited 13 books and more than 150 articles and technical reports on the implications of current and future demographic and socioeconomic change.
